Turtle Bay Exploration Park is located at the center of the 200-mile-long Sacramento River Parkway in Redding, California. The rich natural and human history of Turtle Bay made it a perfect choice for developing a world-renowned natural history, art and science museum campus. One of the most popular features of the TBEP is the Sundial Bridge, which has become a community icon.
